

AGP-E Declaration of Conformity for Packaging Materials PPWR 2025_40 (PPWR)

1. Unique identification of the articles

This Declaration is generic for all Glass containers produced by Ardagh in the glass producing and decorating facilities in Europe.

2. Supplier and authorized representative

Ardagh Glass Packaging Europe covering all legal entities

3. Responsibility statement

This Declaration of Conformity is issued under the sole responsibility of the article supplier.

4. Object of the declaration

This statement applies to all glass containers specified in the sales contract under the AGP-E item numbers.

Traceability is ensured via the details corresponding to the pallet ticket number.

5. Conformity statement

AGP-E hereby declares that, as at the point of delivery, the Materials do not contain PFAS and Heavy metals in a concentration equal to or above the prescribed limits stated in the PPWR 2025/40 article 5. In accordance with Article 5(4) of the PPWR, the sum of the concentrations of lead, cadmium, mercury, and hexavalent chromium in packaging or packaging components shall not exceed 100 mg/kg.¹

However, glass packaging benefits from a long-standing derogation, as established in Commission Decision 2001/171/EC,² which allows glass packaging to exceed the 100 mg/kg threshold provided it complies with the specific conditions set out in Articles 4 and 5 of that Decision. In particular, no lead, cadmium, mercury or hexavalent chromium may be intentionally introduced during manufacture and any exceedance of the concentration limit must be solely due to the addition of recycled materials. Furthermore, the average concentration of heavy metals measured over twelve consecutive months should not exceed 200 ppm.³

Article 70(3) of the PPWR explicitly provides that Commission Decision 2001/171/EC shall remain in force and continue to apply.

While Article 5(8) of the PPWR empowers the European Commission to adopt delegated acts to amend or repeal the derogation in the future, no such amendments or repeals have been adopted to date. As a result, the derogation remains valid and enforceable.

6. Standards, technical specifications

This declaration is based upon the information provided to Ardagh by its raw material, Coating suppliers, Ardagh's own analysis and risk assessment of the manufacturing process relating to the formation of the Materials, and external Lab analyses. Details can be shared on request.

Ardagh is not responsible for any processing, filling or other use of the Materials after the point of delivery or for the overall conformity of the Customer's Packaging with PPWR.

8. Additional Information

AGP-E understands that the articles covered by this Declaration of Conformity are used by the customer to form packaging for the customer's products and is not responsible for any processing, filling or other use of the materials after the point of delivery or for the overall conformity of the customer's packaging with PPWR.
